3/ Update of Actions from Previous Minutes

Lorry noise and smell from Waste Disposal Plant

Dear Mr Riley

Thank you very much for your letter dated 14th August 2012 regarding the Councils Powderhall Waste Transfer Station on Broughton Road. I am sorry you are experiencing problems with odour emanating from our Powderhall Transfer Station.

The Plant has 3 methods of odour control in place to reduce the impact on the surrounding area. A suppression system which produces a fine mist over the tipped waste reducing dust and odours, hydraulic doors which are kept closed except when refuse collection vehicles are being tipped to contain odour and dust within the building and there are three deodorisers which continually spray a fragrance over the waste and outside the reception area.

The Scottish Environmental Protection Agency closely monitor the plant to ensure we comply with the conditions in our site licence. SEPA officers arrive unannounced and carry out site inspections. The staff and supervisors also monitor the area at the tipping stalls to proactively deal with any odour issues that arise by using a portable deodoriser. Unfortunately, there has been a fault with this piece of equipment which may have caused the upsurge in odour you have reported. This has now been repaired and I hope the situation will now improve.

The long term future of Powderhall is not yet fixed, however The Council is currently procuring new waste treatment facilities. The main waste reception site will then move to a site at Millerhill just within The Midlothian Council area. It is anticipated that this will be operational in 2017. At that point Powderhall will no longer be required as the Council's main transfer station and landfill waste will be tipped elsewhere.

A review of our depots across the city is being undertaken and this will establish if there will be

an ongoing requirement to retain Powderhall as an operational depot.

If Powderhall is required beyond 2017 any work required to upgrade the site will be identified at this time. Staff at Powderhall would be happy to host a visit for you and other local residents to show how the site is operated and what is done to instigate any nuisance.

Please let me know if you would like to take up this offer.

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Parking and Powderhall Road adoption

A Meeting of Edinburgh Council's TIE Committee was held on 13th September and Convenor Hinds and Andrew have since been in contact with regard to further discussions between the Council and the owners of Powderhall Village and Hopetoun Village.

Powderhall Village Flood Prevention Scheme

Ian has had no further feedback from the contractors regarding the unfinished planting work on the Powderhall side of the Water of Leith.

Gardening Sub-Committee

Brian Hunter has quoted for work relating to the soil erosion and slippage on the B&Q boundary bed (£2480 + VAT), the cost of which the Committee considered to be high. Gordon has investigated a honeycomb mat solution with pins to hold the soil in place. The matting can thereafter be filled with stones or seed. Brian Hunter to be invited to comment on this.

After a meeting with F rans Kooy, Brian has quoted (£ 390) for the introduction of 45 cascading ivy plants to be introduced from the top of the wall opposite the Town Houses. Gordon is to investigate alternative plantings. As this planting will need to be undertaken in October/ November, there is some urgency to start on this.

Grass quality

The grass throughout the village does not appear to have been fed for a number of years, and is beginning to look rather patchy in areas. Brian Hunter to be asked about this.

There is no longer any grass in the entrance to the Childrens Playground, and following rainfall it becomes an ever deeper puddle. Paving probably would not meet with safety regulations, but the safety paving already in areas of the playground would be a possible solution. Can Sarah look into this immediately?

Gordon is to print up a notice advising on the EGM, and Ian has volunteered to circulate these and to post them on all front and rear stair entrance doors, commencing week of 8th October. It is hoped that as many owners as possible will be able to attend.
